

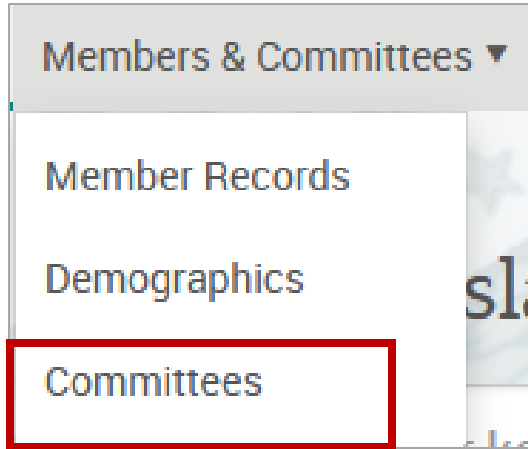

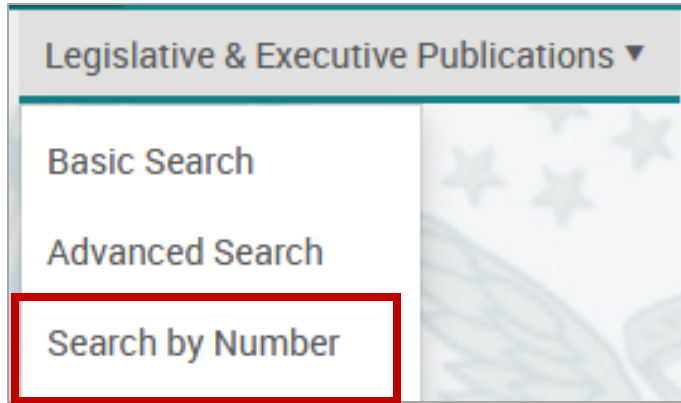

Biometric technologies use unique biological or behavioral attributes, such as DNA, fingerprints, cardiac signatures, voice or gait patterns, and facial or ocular measurements, to authenticate an individual's identity. Although biometric technologies have been in use for decades, recent advances in artificial intelligence and big data analytics have expanded their application. Biometric technologies are currently used for several Congressionally authorized or mandated security applications throughout the U.S. Government, including for transportation and border security. The Department of Defense (DOD) also utilizes deployable biometric and forensic capabilities to support a range of military operations, such as targeting, force protection, and humanitarian assistance.

A prominent example of biometric technology is facial recognition technology (FRT). In general, FRT systems use facial recognition algorithms to compare identity information from facial features in two face image samples and produce a measure of similarity between them. This information can be used to determine whether the same person is in both images. FRT is used by law enforcement agencies to assist in the investigation of crimes and to identify missing persons and persons of interest and in counterterrorism activities. The Traveler Verification Service (TVS), a public-private partnership between the Department of Homeland Security (DHS), Customs and Border Protection (CBP), and private airlines, airports, and cruise lines, utilizes FRT to verify travelers' identities. DHS's Office of Biometric Identity Management (OBIM) maintains a biometric database called the Automated Biometric Identification System (IDENT), holding more than 250 million unique identifiers, that is used for a variety of purposes, including to detect and prevent illegal entry into the U.S., facilitate travel, and verify visa applications.

Advancements in biometric technologies are largely driven by the commercial sector. Commercial applications of biometric technologies include secure physical access, including to a locked door or automobile, and electronic access, such as unlocking personal computers, smartphones, or online accounts. Other commercial applications include theft deterrence, customer service and payment processing, and photo organization. Biometric technologies and FRT are being utilized within the hospital and health care industries to verify the identity of a patient and link that patient's health care data and were recently employed to help track the spread of the novel coronavirus (COVID-19).

There are a number of ethical concerns over the increasing use of biometric technologies. For example, researchers have repeatedly found that artificial intelligence-trained facial recognition programs fall disproportionately when used for women and people of color due to both the models and the data on which the programs were trained. Privacy and the security of personal data are also a concern, and attempted hacking of biometric data is on the rise. FRT may collect or store facial images without individuals' consent. There is currently no comprehensive Federal privacy law governing the collection, use, and sale of personal information by private-sector companies. As these technologies continue to mature and proliferate, they will likely hold growing implications for Congressional oversight, civil liberties, defense authorizations, military and intelligence concepts of operations, and the future.

Historical Background

Leading up to the 2024 elections, the 118th congress started with a fiercely divided House and Senate

The House struggled to elect a Speaker at the beginning of the session, voting began on January 3rd with Kevin McCarthy as the Republican nominee, however he was unable to get the 218 votes needed to secure the position. Democrats easily voted in Hakeem Jeffries as the minority leader, with 212 votes on January 3rd. Voting for a Speaker resumed on the 4th, however 19 republicans remained hold outs, preferring a more conservative nominee, nominating Jim Jordan as an alternative to McCarthy. Voting lasted 5 days and on January 7th Kevin McCarthy finally received enough votes and was elected speaker at 12:37am on the 15th vote.

On October 3rd, Representative Matt Gaetz of Florida, filed a successful
